  - The district hired a new superintendent of schools, Mark Schwarz.

  - The preliminary budget was set for an 3.11% increase YoY, but the board voted on an 2% increase removing some redundancies.
  - The new budget will include three elementary world language teachers, a theatre teacher at RHS, two elementary PE teachers, and three special education inclusion teachers.
